1ST STOP – COLOMBO NATIONAL MUSEUM

4TH STOP – PETTAH MARKET

Its architecture seamlessly blends modern design with traditional influences, making it a captivating sight for visitors. The lighthouse is surrounded by lush green lawns and the rhythmic sound of waves crashing against the shore, creating a serene ambiance. 7TH STOP – OLD PARLIAMENT BUILDING

Situated along the scenic Galle Face Green, this historic edifice was completed in 1930 during British colonial rule and served as the legislative seat of the country until the new parliament complex was established in Sri Jayawardenepura Kotte in 1982. The building's neoclassical architectural style is characterized by its grand columns, intricate carvings, and stately façade, which exudes an air of dignity and authority. The impressive portico and symmetrical design reflect the influence of ancient Greek and Roman architecture, making it a notable landmark in Colombo.

8TH STOP – GALLE FACE GREEN

Galle Face Green is a vibrant, picturesque oceanfront park located in the heart of Colombo, Sri Lanka's bustling capital. This expansive stretch of green lawn, which runs alongside the sparkling Indian Ocean, offers locals and tourists alike a serene escape from the city's hustle and bustle. Originally laid out by the British in 1859, Galle Face Green has a rich history as a place for horse racing and other sports. Today, it is a popular destination for families, couples, and friends to gather for leisurely walks, picnics, kite flying, and enjoying the stunning sunsets over the ocean. The promenade is lined with food vendors offering a variety of delicious local snacks, from spicy chickpeas and fresh coconuts to Sri Lanka's famous "isso wade" (prawn fritters). The vibrant atmosphere is enhanced by the sight of children playing, street performers entertaining crowds, and locals engaging in their evening exercises.

9TH STOP – ENDEMIC WOOD CARVING GALLERY.

Sri Lanka, which is famous for handicrafts, holds a long history of craft heritage. According to “Mahawamsa” the prevailed arts and crafts were innovated with the arrival of Buddhist Nun “Sanghamitta” to Sri Lanka from India. The history records that crafts men belong to sixty different castes arrived to Sri Lanka along with her on her visit that brought the Sacred Bo- Tree to Anuradhapura.

With this heritage Sri Lanka got fame all over the world for its arts and crafts. Still there are traditional carpenters who are engaged in wood carving. They create those age old master pieces. But the problem is that you will not be able to see them everywhere. For that you have now got a chance to see how those alluring creations are begot.
